

ORCHESTRA LIBRARY FELLOWSHIP

The New World Symphony is seeking to fill a vacancy for its library fellowship. New World Symphony fellowships are awarded on a season-to-season basis for up to three years. Ideally, the selected applicant will start this September for the 2026-27 Season.

This fellowship is designed for the individual who has decided on a career of performance librarian for an orchestra/ensemble/college conservatory but needs to acquire the daily exposure and hands on experience necessary to win such a job.

The library fellow will work closely with the orchestra musicians, Music Library Director, other staff members from different departments, and all the performing artists as well as the Artistic Director, and Artistic Director Laureate. This fellowship teaches all aspects of running a busy orchestra library including all the administrative responsibilities of such a position.

Qualifications:

Bachelor's degree in music and prior orchestra library experience is required. Must be able to read music in a variety of clefs and have knowledge of transposition of instruments. Comprehensive knowledge and experience with music engraving/editing software is preferred. Applicants should have the qualities of an even-temperament, able to work well and productively under pressure, understand the flexible work hours that may be necessary, and be able to take direction with a positive attitude

The fellowship provides local housing and a weekly stipend of \$656. The 2026-27 season is 35 weeks.
